Kids Against Hunger

Mark Saturday, February 4th on your schedule to participate in the Kids Against Hunger food packing sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of the Woodhaven, Yake School PTO, Erving School PTO, Weiss School PTO, Parsons School PTO and the Bates School PTO and the Junior National Honor Society from Patrick Henry Middle School. **Event Chairperson, Paul Elsey and Larry Williams will need our support as we bring together 600 third, fourth and fifth graders, as well as, eighth and ninth graders to pack 20,000 meals and the WHS Varsity Hockey Team!**

Kids Against Hunger is a nonprofit organization with the mission to significantly reduce the number of hungry children in the USA and to feed starving children throughout the world. This is being achieved by getting volunteers involved, and by setting up food packaging satellites in the USA, and through partnerships with humanitarian organizations worldwide - enabling Kids Against Hunger to deliver its specially formulated rice-soy casserole to starving children and their families here in our Community and in over 40 countries.

Did you know 40,000 children die every day from malnutrition, starvation and hunger-related diseases? **The solution is a revolutionary food package that has been developed by some of the world's leading food scientists at Cargill, Pillsbury, General Mills and ADM. This one package provides six nutritionally-complete servings to feed starving children around the world, as well as, the hungry here at home, and all for the very low cost of 28¢ per serving.**

Kids Against Hunger is one of our signature projects and hopefully every member will join us on February 4th. Our Club has committed \$7,700⁰⁰ to this project and hopefully, the support of our entire Club.

Woodhaven Kiwanians spent December helping Santa

- Saturday, December 3rd Woodhaven Kiwanians along with members of the WHS Marching Band and the WHS Cross Country Team rang the Salvation Army Bell at the Woodhaven Wal-Mart raising over \$1,817.17 for the Downriver Salvation Army.
- Woodhaven Kiwanians donated \$300 to the Brownstown Goodfellows, \$300 to the Trenton Goodfellows and \$300 to the Gibraltar Goodfellows. We also donated \$300 to Woodhaven's *Shop with a Cop Program*.
- Woodhaven Kiwanians answered also 500 letters to Santa mailed at the Woodhaven Community Center. Woodhaven McDonalds provided a free Kids Meal for each child and Woodhaven Lanes provided shoes and two games of bowling.
- We provided the Kiwanis bus and driver for the Woodhaven Senior Citizens to go out to dinner and tour the Wayne County Holiday lights in Hines Park.
- Woodhaven Kiwanians provided a new washer and dryer for a large family in our School District who had no washer & dryer. We teamed up with Brownstown Middle School and the Sears Outlet Store.
- Joe Sufficool and Paul Elsey delivered a truck load of food from the School District that would not last over the winter break to Lillie Skinner at Core City Neighborhoods, Inc.
- Jim Jorgensen and the Community Services Committee purchased \$330 worth of socks for ChristNet.
- Rosemary Robbins and the Young Children Priority One Committee purchased \$263 worth of toys for the holiday party at the Downriver Guidance Clinic.
